Basic Vocabulary to comprehensively incorporate during class:

During class activities review these basic Spanish lessons. For example: When transitioning from one activity to the next countdown in Spanish 10-0. While coloring point out the colors in Spanish and have the students repeat the colors after you.

For classes with older or advanced students these also may be formally taught.**
