## LIMONADA

In Spanish limes are called *limones*. The Spanish translation for lemonade is called *limonada* regardless of whether you are using limes or lemons.

Thirsty? Try this tasty limonada recipe:

1. -Place two quartered limes or lemons in a blender with 3-4 cups of water and approximately ½ cup of sugar, more or less based on your preference.
2. -Blend until the limes or lemons are completely pulverized. The mixture should be slightly foamy with a whitish color.
3. -Strain the lemonade and add 3-5 more cups of water.
- 4 -Serve with or without ice based on individual preference.

Get your student thinking about Spanish outside the class - Anytime you see or hear Spanish point it out to your child! Listen to a Spanish radio station or play one on Pandora!
