Practice at Home

Now you can make new sentences using the Spanish vocabulary to describe what you see “Yo veo ____.”

Examples:

Yo veo la policía.- *I see the police.*
Yo veo las flores.- *I see the flowers.*

Play a game of I spy in Spanish by saying “Yo veo (vocabulary word in Spanish).” You can play this in the car as you drive through town with vocabulary words above or at home with: la cama, el toalla, el papel, la mesa, la silla, el jabón, etc.

We played I spy (*Yo veo*) in el pueblo in Mexico. Below is a picture of la calles. Notice that the houses and shops are brightly colored. In most Latin American towns and cities there is a main plaza or town square. A cathedral or church (la iglesia) usually stands on one end, a government building on the other, and shops (tiendas), food vendors, balloon and craft sellers, and families are crowded around. Common things to see in the town square are: los bancos, la gente, la fuente, los árboles, y las flores.
