Grammar Review:

-el and la mean “*the*”
-un and una mean “*a*” or “*an*”
-Articles and nouns are masculine or feminine.
The article must agree with the noun.
Example: La avenida.
-Adjectives also have gender and need to agree.
Example: Mariaa es alta. Marcoo es alto.

Verb Tense: Future

IR verb conjugation + a + verb infinitive = future (going to)

Example: Yo voy a hacer la cama.

I am going to make the bed.
