¿Cuántos hay? -How many are there?
Hay\_\_\_ \_\_\_. - There are (number) (objects).
Puerta(s)-Door(s)

Piso-floor
Sofa(s)- couch(es)
Barato (a)-Cheap, inexpensive

You can now make several sentences to describe a house in Spanish!

For example:

Mi casa es pequeña.

La casa es blanca.

Mi casa es nueva.

La casa es bonita.

Can you translate these?

#### Más información

In Spanish you do not need to use a word for "it". For example. If someone asked you if the house was big your response does not need a noun. For example;

¿Es la casa grande?

Sí es grande.

See how the answer did not include house or it? In English we would say, "Yes it's big or Yes the house is big." In Spanish the literal translation here is yes, big.

## ¡OJO! REMEMBER TO PRACTICE BASIC CONVERSATIONS:

Persona 1: ¿Cómo estás?

Persona 2: Más o menos. ¿Y tú"?

Persona 1: Mal, gracias.

It's not the answer we like to hear but you can respond to ¿Cómo estás? with mal or muy mal in addition to bien, muy bien, and más o menos.
