Notas Culturas

Meal times differ from country to country. In Spain, there are traditionally four meals daily. A light breakfast is eaten around 7:00 in the morning, and lunch is served around noon. Lunch is the largest meal of the day – meat, vegetables, soup, salad, and dessert. A siesta follows! Around 5-6 p.m., when people are hungry again, it not uncommon to have a "merienda" which translates as a "snack." The merienda is usually a sandwich or a piece of pie – Something to tide the people over until dinnertime. It is common to have the merienda in a café or restaurant. Dinner is the second largest meal of the day & is not eaten until 9:00pm.
