Notas Culturales

The Mercado Nacional de Artesanías is located in Panama Viejo, Panama. This is where many Panamanian indigenous populations from around the country sell their artesanía (handicrafts). Grammar Note

Poder is the Spanish verb that means to be able to. So, when you want to ask if someone can (or is able to) do something, you would use the verb Poder. For example: ¿Puedes ayudarme? Can you help me?

Puede is the present tense singular conjugation for the Usted (formal) subject pronoun. You would use this when speaking to an elder or to show respect. *Puedes* is the present tense singular conjugation for the $t\dot{u}$ (informal) subject pronoun. You would use this when speaking with youth or friends.

Now that the children know this basic verb phrase they are able to build multiple sentences in Spanish. For example: ¿Puede sacar un foto? Can you take a picture? ¿Puedes ver el arte? Can you see the art?

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
