Notas Culturales

This week we learned about Granada, Nicaragua. This city has a warm temperature year round and is located on the northern side of Lake Nicaragua. Many Nicaraguan towns have bakeries that serve turnovers with pineapple or cheeses baked into the dough. Fresh fruit refrescos (fruit juices, sugar, and ice) are also common. Chicharrones (fried pork skin) are a popular snack sold on the streets of Nicaragua. Typically taxis in the U.S. are yellow, but that is not the case in Nicaragua or other Latin American countries where taxis can be all different colors. The taxis in Nicaragua are also usually called moto taxis and are much smaller than the regular taxi.
