- When describing your family, use the words *mi/mis* to signify my family member. For example: *mi padre, mis abuelos.*
- Often times, as a "cariño" (sign of affection) Hispanics add *-ito* onto family words. For example: *Abuelita* or little grandma. In Costa Rica, they add *-tico* onto the end of their words instead which is why Costa Ricans are often nick-named "Ticos."
