Did you know? Children all over Mexico and Latin America like playing games too? Here is one of the traditional games to play with your friends!

Gallinita Ciega – To play this game, you need a handkerchief and three or more people to play Choose somebody to be the hen *(gallinita)*. Then put the handkerchief over the hen's eyes and turn the "blind hen" around for a few seconds. After that, everybody runs and the blind hen has to catch somebody and guess who that person is. If the blind hen is right, that person becomes the new blind hen. If not, the hen is blindfolded again and the game continues.

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
