Grammar Review:

- You can abbreviate Usted and Ustedes with Ud. and Uds. respectively. Remember that these words signify the formal you (Ud.) and the formal you plural (Uds.).

- a + el = al

When there is a masculine noun after “a” in a Spanish sentence signifying “to”, the words are combined as above.

For example: Voy al mercado.

I go to the market.

There is no combination with feminine nouns.

For example: Voy a la casa.

I go to the house.

Keep practicing Spanish at home with your children. They will remember much more!
At least 5 minutes a night can make a difference.
