### **Notas Culturas / Class Activities**

Today we talked about the different words used to describe students and teachers in Spanish. The word "maestro" is used to refer to a teacher who teaches young children. Young students are referred to as "alumnos." The word "profesor" is used to refer to a teacher who teaches older children- usually of late high school or college age. The students are called "estudiantes" when they are older.

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
