Put your *pies* in, put your *pies* out

Repeat using: *piernas, brazos, y manos*

Practice at Home

It is great to practice the vocabulary from class about five minutes per day to reinforce what your students are learning in class. Here are some fun ways to get your children excited about learning Spanish!

Practice the body parts in Spanish by doing exercises or stretches together. You can also count in Spanish with your child: 1-Uno, 2-Dos, 3-Tres, 4-Cuatro, 5-Cinco, 6-Seis, 7-Siete, 8-Ocho, 9-Nueve, 10-Diez

Play a fun game of “*Simón Dice*” (Simon Says) in Spanish to review the body parts. When you say “*Simón dice toca* (body part)” your child should touch that body part. If you only say, “*Toca* (body part),” Simon didn’t say, so he or she shouldn’t touch the body part.
