Grammar

Today we learned to combine the IR verb conjugations, places, and transportation form sentences like:

IR verb conjugation + a la/al + place + por/en + transportation.
 “En” is used for shorter trips and “por” is used for longer trips.
 *Voy al parque en bicicleta. *I go to the park by bicycle.*
 *Vamos a California por el avión. *We go to California by plane.*

Notas Culturas / Class Activities

Today we talked about how language says a lot about one's culture. For example, in the United States we only have one word to say love and one to say like. We use love to talk about the love of our families, love between husbands and wives and how much we love ice cream! In Spanish, however, there are many different words. For example: You would say, “Me gusta helado mucho” for ice cream. “Quiero a mis papas” for I love my parents and “Amo a mi esposo” for I love my husband. Gustar, querer, amar are three different verbs in Spanish to express love.
