Tip: If you want help with pronunciation, go to wordreference.com and type in any vocabulary word. It will show you the phonetic spelling and allow you to hear the word.

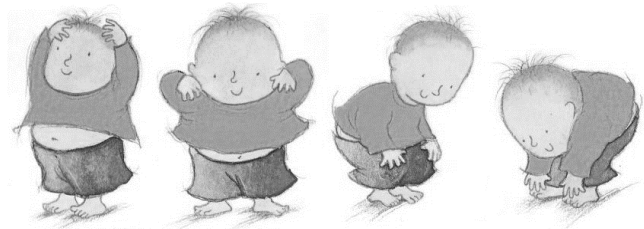
We encourage you to practice vocabulary at home with your children. They will remember much more!
