We encourage you to practice vocabulary at home with your children. They will remember much more! Each week the students have been learning a color of the day. We share objects of that color and pass them around the circle for a "color parade" while practicing the colors in Spanish.

Today we learned a song to review colors in Spanish. Encourage your children to sing this with you and find something of the color while singing. Insert new colors each round.

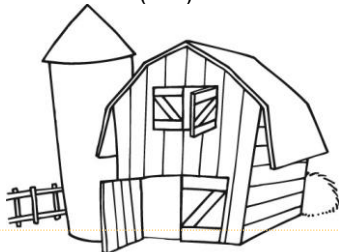
(Sing to the tune of "The More We Get Together")

Did you know the sounds animals make are different in Spanish speaking countries? For example: the sound a dog makes is "gauu gauu." Encourage your child to say the different animal sounds below:

Pollito (chicken): pío pío
Rana (frog): cruá cruá
Gallo (rooster): kikiriki
Gato (cat): miau
