Today we started to introduce singular subject pronouns and the verb ser, which means to be. Ser can be a tricky one for students, as there are two verbs – ser and estar – that both mean “to be”. Therefore, both are used for the English words “am, is and are.” The general rule is that Ser is used to discuss things that are permanent, but of course there are many exceptions!
