

¿Guapo, bonito o feo?

It can sometimes be confusing for an English speaker to understand which adjective to choose. For a girl it is common to say Ella es *bonita*. For a boy it is more common to say Él es *guapo*. To describe an object like a couch, it is more common to use bonito/feo. El sofa es *bonito*. El sofa es *feo*.

Notas Culturas / Class Activities
