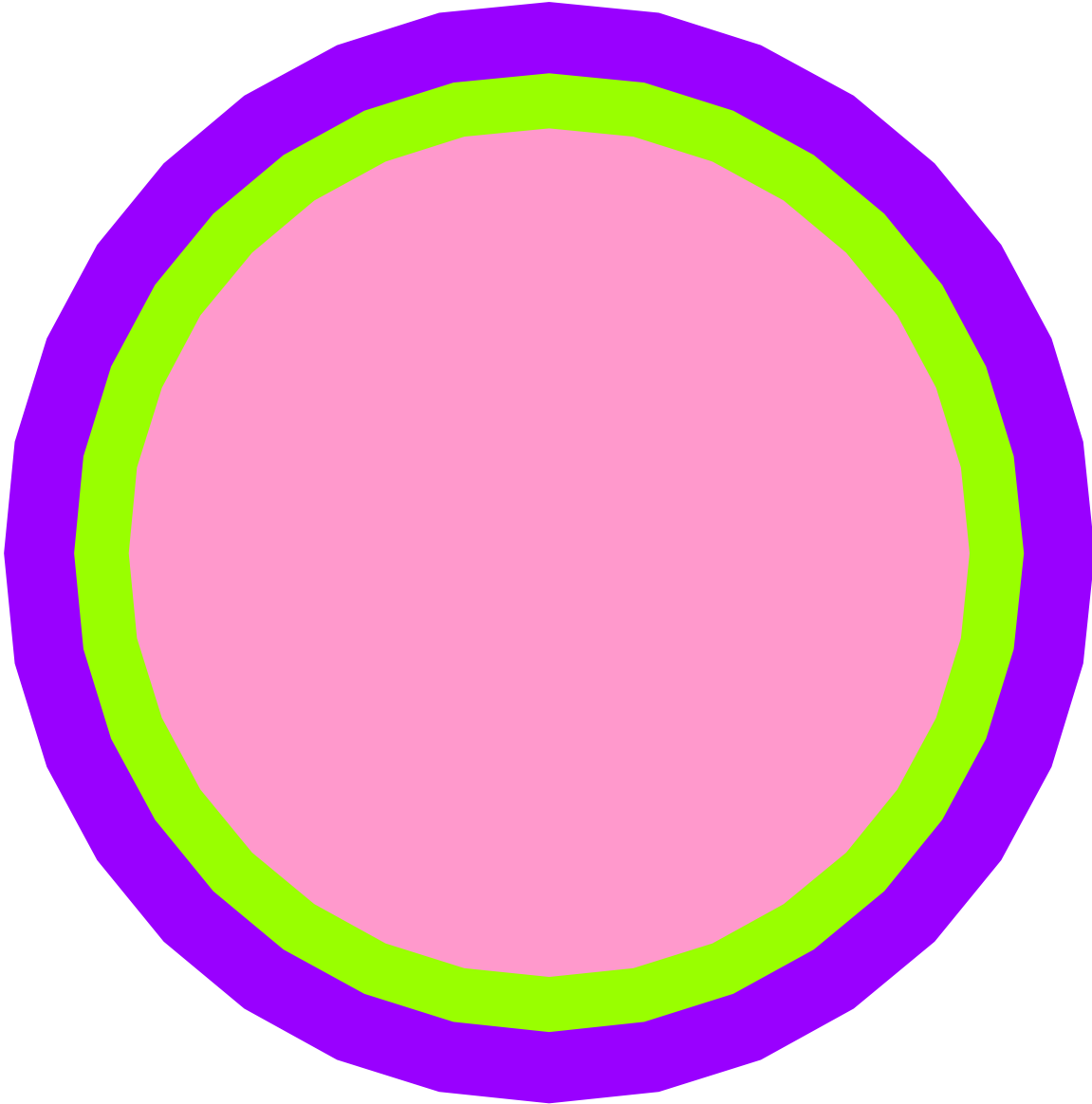
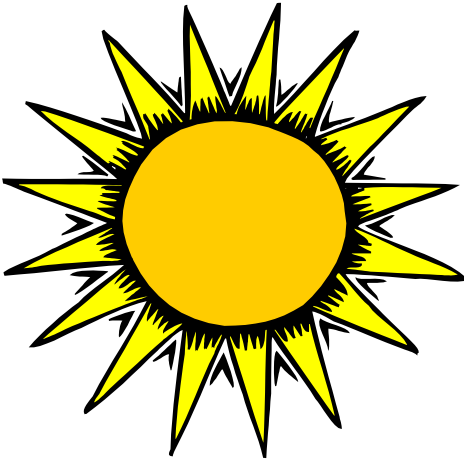


Weather Wheel!



Draw lines to divide the "wheel" in fourths and then cut out the whole circle. Glue it and the arrow to pieces of cardboard so they'll be more durable. Attach the arrow to the center of the circle with a paper fastener so that it can move. Glue one weather shape in each fourth. Each day ask your child, "¿Qué tiempo hace?" Move the arrow to the wedge accordingly encouraging your child to use the phrases below. Daily routines like this are great for reinforcing learning!

Hace sol (It is sunny)

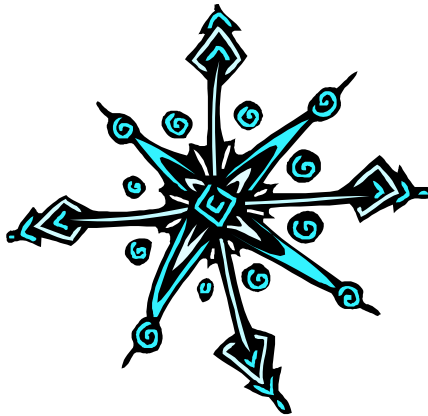
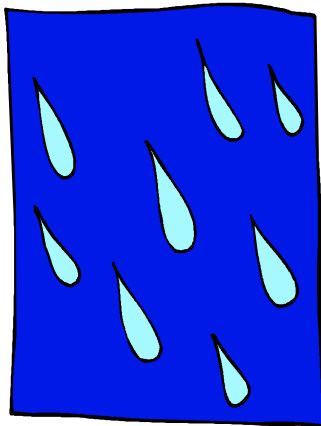
Hace frío (It is cold)

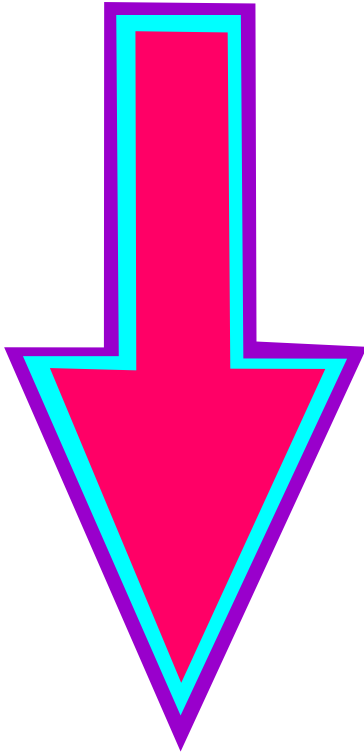
Hace calor (It is hot)

Extra! Weather Mobile-This is a fun craft to do with the children. Have them each cut out a large cloud and label it for them "Tiempo". Attach three pieces of yarn to the cloud. Have children make different weather shapes such as a snowflake, raindrop, and a sun. (Use bright colored construction paper.) Inside the shape help the children write the words in Spanish-Sol, Lluvia, or Nieve. Attach the pictures to the end of the pieces of string. Makes a very cute mobile to take home.
