**Almuerzo** -After you learn the vocabulary for lunch words. Have the students complete this worksheet by drawing lines from the picture to the correct word. It would be extra fun if you brought in real or plastic food and had the children say the corresponding Spanish words out loud.

**Hangman**-I am not sure how many of you remember how to play hangman, but it is great review and fun! Draw the hangman form on the board. Have the vocabulary words written on small pieces of paper. One person chose a word and not tell anyone. For example: Ingles. That team member would put six dashes underneath the hangman. Other class members can guess letters. Example: Is there an "a"? If the letter is not in the word you draw a part of the body onto the hangman form. Keep doing this until they hang the man or guess the word! Have them use only Spanish alphabet letters for practice. You can have teams for this game, as well.

**Bingo**-Bingo is always a great standby. Use the enclosed sheet and have the students write the new vocabulary words in the squares. (Make sure each student makes a different "board".) You will call out vocabulary words. If a student has that word in the place you called, he or she can mark it. You can bring in dried beans or Skittles as markers. You can change it around using four corners, diagonal, full board, etc. to be winners. Every age group likes Bingo!

**Me gusta/no Me gusta**-Using the enclosed worksheet have your students draw pictures of the classes they like and don't like. Have them separate into groups of two or three and tell each other what classes they like and don't like using words like divertida, aburrida, etc.
