- Practice counting things in the classroom in Spanish. *¿Cuántos hay?* means how many are there. To answer you would say, *Hay ____*. There is/are _____. For example, *¿Cuántos ventanas hay?* How many windows are there? *Hay cuatro ventanas*. There are four windows.
- Practice math in Spanish by adding numbers by using *y*, which means and/plus. *Son* means equals. For example: *Uno y dos son tres*. One plus two is three. For subtraction, *menos* means less. For example: *Tres menos dos son uno*. Three minus two is one.
- Larger multiples in Spanish are: *trienta* (30), *cuarenta* (40), *cincuenta* (50), *sesenta* (60), *setenta* (70), *ochenta* (80), *noventa* (90) y *cien* (100).
