Notas Culturales

Today we learned about the *zócalo*, or main square in Mexican cities, and that most cities have one. There is usually a cathedral or church on one end, a government building on the other, and shops, food vendors, balloon sellers, musicians, and families crowded all around. We explained that families may spend an afternoon in the *zócalo* together, enjoying the entertainment, the food, and the sights. Some foods that are sold here are: *helado*, *paletas*, *elote* (with crema or mayonesa, chile powder, *sal y limón* *shown below), *tacos*, *jícama* (with chile powder, *sal y limón*) and *palomitas*. Do you remember what *elote* is from class?
