### Notas Culturas~ Culture Notes

Traditions of *la Navidad*/Christmas time may vary in different countries. The Spanish word for Christmas Eve is *la Nochebuena*. This is one of the most important nights in Spanish-speaking countries as families gather for dinner and celebrate together. Christmas day (*Navidad*) is often a quieter day for family and rest. Smaller gifts may be exchanged these days, but the larger gift-giving is on *Día de los Reyes Magos* on January 6<sup>th</sup>.

Typical foods eaten during these holiday celebrations are:  
 Mexico: *tamales*, *pozole*, and *ponche* (a warm fruit punch)  
 Spain: roast lamb or seafood, *turrón* (almond nougat)  
 Puerto Rico: roast pork and *coquito* (coconut eggnog)  
 Fun fact~ the poinsettia flower, known as the *Flor de Nochebuena*, originated in Mexico.

A popular song at Christmas time is "Feliz Navidad" by José Feliciano.
