Los cascarones son cáscaras de huevo vacías, decoradas con colores brillantes y rellenas de confeti. Se usan como tradición festiva, especialmente durante la Pascua y otras celebraciones, donde se rompen sobre la cabeza de alguien, simbolizando buena suerte y amistad. La palabra española "cascarones" significa "cáscaras de huevo".

Los cascarones son populares durante la Pascua y el Carnaval en México y Guatemala, pero también en otras celebraciones como el Cinco de Mayo, cumpleaños y bodas. Esta tradición es también popular en el suroeste de Estados Unidos.

Para hacer cascarones (huevos de confeti), necesitarás: huevos, confeti, pegamento y papel de seda. Primero, rompe el huevo con cuidado por la parte superior, retira el contenido y enjuaga la cáscara. Luego, decora la cáscara, llénala de confeti y sella la abertura con papel de seda y pegamento. Cuando rompas los cascarones, hazlo suavemente con el papel de seda hacia abajo. Para los niños pequeños, rompe el huevo con la mano sobre su cabeza en lugar de directamente sobre ella. ¡Disfruta de la tradición!

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Cascarones are empty eggshells, decorated with bright colors and filled with confetti. They are used as a festive tradition, especially during Easter and other celebrations, where they are broken over someone's head, symbolizing good luck and friendship. The Spanish word "cascarones" means "eggshells."

Cascarones are popular during Easter and Carnival in Mexico and Guatemala, but also at other celebrations such as Cinco de Mayo, birthdays, and weddings. This tradition is also popular in the southwestern of the United States.

To make cascarones (confetti eggs), you will need: eggs, confetti, glue, and tissue paper. First, carefully crack the egg from the top, remove the contents, and rinse the shell. Next, decorate the shell, fill it with confetti, and seal the opening with tissue paper and glue. When breaking the cascarones, do so gently with the tissue paper facing down. For young children, crack the egg with your hand above their head rather than directly on it. Enjoy the tradition!
