8. NOTA CULTURAL: El Mercado de Chichicastenango. Chichicastenango Market!



Perched on a high mountain ridge encircled by a pine forest, the Quiche Maya town of Chichicastenango in Guatemala hosts the most famous indigenous market in Central America. Chichicastenango is renowned for its vibrant, open-air market and for its rich Mayan culture and religious practices. On Sundays and Thursdays, its central plaza overflows with fresh flowers, traditional foods, colorful handcrafts and practical housewares. The town is a center for K'iche' Maya traditions, with its market serving as a meeting point for villagers from surrounding areas.

Though the ride involves winding mountain roads, the views are breathtaking and well worth the journey. Chichicastenango Market is more than just a marketplace; it's a vibrant cultural hub where centuries-old traditions come alive. The journey to get there is as much a part of the experience as the market itself.
