Students explored the calendar of the year and learned about special dates and celebrations in Spanish-speaking countries. We discussed how different cultures mark important milestones, including traditions like a *quinceañera*, which is a celebration of a girl's 15th birthday in many Latin American countries. Students compared these traditions to celebrations they know and reflected on how different cultures honor important moments throughout the year.

Grammar Note!

A fun grammar fact: In English, months are always capitalized (January, February, March), but in Spanish, months are not capitalized unless they begin a sentence (*enero, febrero, marzo*). This difference helps highlight how spelling and grammar rules can vary between languages.

septiembre (right hand on left waist),
octubre (left hand on right waist)
noviembre (right hand on right hip),
diciembre (left hand on left hip)
