Notas Culturales

Students explored winter in Spanish-speaking countries and discovered how different climates and traditions can be around the world. We learned that in places like Patagonia in Argentina and Chile, as well as the Andes Mountains, people experience snowy winters and enjoy activities like skiing, snowboarding, and sledding. Students also discovered that winter in the southern hemisphere happens from June to August, which is opposite from what we experience in the United States.

In addition to winter sports, many countries celebrate with warm foods, family traditions, and cultural festivals, showing that even in cold weather, there is still plenty of joy and celebration.

Students learned about winter and explored the types of clothing people wear and activities they enjoy during the season. We discussed how people stay warm with items like coats, scarves, gloves, and boots, and how winter activities can include things like playing in the snow, building snowmen, and enjoying warm drinks. Students made connections between weather, clothing, and seasonal activities in different parts of the world.
