This week, students learned Christmas vocabulary in Spanish and explored how holiday traditions can be both similar and different across Spanish-speaking countries. We discussed common words related to the holiday season as well as cultural traditions such as family gatherings, festive foods, music, and celebrations. Students also compared how Christmas is celebrated in different places, noticing that while traditions may vary, many cultures share the joy of spending time with family and celebrating together.

Students explored holiday traditions from Spanish-speaking countries and learned how families celebrate the season in different ways around the world. We compared celebrations such as La Navidad in Mexico, parranda traditions in Puerto Rico, and holiday foods and festivities in Spain, as well as special traditions like *Día de los Reyes* and *Las Posadas*. Students discovered that while the foods, music, and customs may vary, many cultures share the same themes of family, togetherness, joy, and celebration during the holiday season.
